#### Ladies and Gentlemen.

Konichiwa and a very Good Afternoon.

- First of all, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to all of you for the warm welcome accorded to me.
- Today, on behalf of the People and the Government of Japan, I am honoured to hand over this new fully furnished classroom block, equipped with two water tanks, to the Banban Primary School.
- This project was formalised in 2017 upon the request by the school management and the Ministry of Education and Training to address the overcrowded

classrooms caused by the rapid growing population settled in the suburban districts of Luganville.

- The Government of Japan, as a response, provided funding worth around Eighty Four Thousands US Dollars (USD\$84,504) or approximately Seven Million Seven Hundred Thousands Vanuatu Vatu (VT 7,708,994) for this project under Japan's Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects Programme or GGP in short.
- The GGP Programme is a part of overall Japanese ODA (Official Development Assistance) which is implemented by the Embassy of

Japan to empower people from the grassroots level.

- The GGP Programme in Vanuatu has been widely implemented various areas including that of education. To date. Japan has implemented 130 than more projects under this programme in Vanuatu, which amount to approximate value of USD 10.3 million, and around 60% of them been contributed to have the education sector.
- It is because that Japan truly realizes that education or human resources development has the vital importance for the nation building of a country including Vanuatu.

● I am more than happy to witness the completion of these high standard education facilities in Banban Primary School, which I can officially hand over today.

### Ladies and Gentlemen,

● In the formalisation process of this project, Japan had expressed our hope that this building would be also able to provide a safe haven for the community during natural disasters. As such, we were glad to hear that this building withstood the damaging winds caused by TC Harold and provided refuge to families in the Banban community.

- For this, we acknowledge the quality work carried out by the Ministry of Education in ensuring the construction of this building complied with Category 5 standards.
- The Government of Japan is taking a lead role in promoting Disaster Risk Reduction in this region, and this project has really become an impressive testament to its climate resilient infrastructure.
- It is important for us to realize that rebuilding school facilities should be conducive not only to better learning environment but also to promotion of resilience against natural disasters in line



with the spirit of "Build Back Better."

- Last but not least, I sincerely hope that the due care and good maintenance will be undertaken by teachers, school managers as well as other responsible authorities and all people of the community of Banban Primary School to ensure that this new classroom block and equipment will continue to serve you all and your children for many years to come.
